### White Rose Home Learning Guidance for Parents and Carers

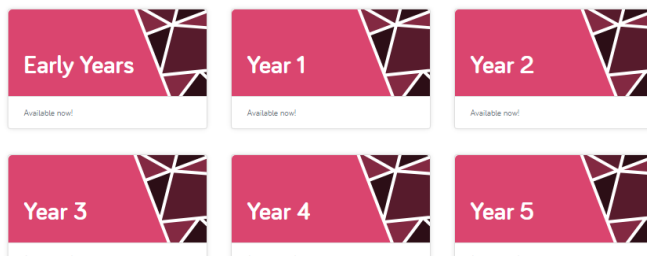
As home learning continues, we have been looking at the resources available to help make maths useful and accessible for you all, whilst keeping it relevant and meaningful for the children.

In school, we follow White Rose supported by Power Maths. To help the children access what we would be teaching in school, we recommend you follow the White Rose home learning:

Like school, they have recommended a 2 week break but do plan to do some Easter themed fun activities, which we will display on the twitter feed when known. I've sent the letter out early to give you the chance to explore the site ready for when learning starts again.

When you have clicked on the site and scroll down you will see:



Select the year group (Year 6 is also there). You will then see the work set out in weeks. The format shows a video clip, this starts with a flashback task, the children will know this as power up. The next part explores the learning task for the day. We recognise it would be costly to print the work sheets but all children have been given a maths book. To keep it simple, write the date and lesson E.g. 8/4/ 20. Week 1 lesson 3 and record the answers in the book. The session tells you when to use the work book and provides reasoning opportunities in each session.

As always, we are with you during this difficult time and recognise the maths concepts will at times, cause frustration and challenges.
